SCHOOLING AND A CHILD'S SPIRITUAL FORMATION

The Barna group recently conducted research late in 2018 among church leaders surrounding the question, "Who is responsible for the spiritual formation of a child?" The data leads to a couple things: 1) agreement that the responsibility of a child's spiritual formation lies first with the parents and second with the church and 2) schools are perceived to be an overall negative influence on the spiritual formation of a child.

What makes this most concerning is that school is where children spend the majority of their weekdays in the supervision and care of a school system. It appears that parents and churches are fighting an uphill battle concerning the quantity of hours spent with their child(ren) and content management during school hours. This may naturally lead to contemplation of the importance of partnering with Christian Schools surrounding the spiritual development of their child(ren).

BIGGER PICTURE

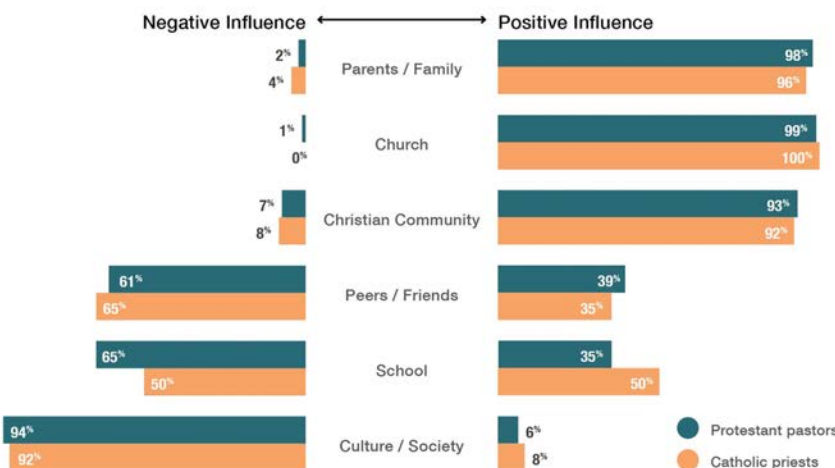
