## THANKFUL PEOPLE ARE HUMBLE & HAPPY

As we often focus on being thankful at Thanksgiving and Christmas time, it's helpful to remember why try to learn things about them before giving your spiel. Being thankful is such an important mindset. At its root, a truly thankful person is also a humble person, and a humble person is a happy person. So, to teach students gratitude, we must start at the root and teach humility.


What is humility? Many people in our self-esteem focused culture mistake humility for something negative. If we are familiar with the scripture in Micah 6:8 we know that the Lord requires us to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God." But when asked what humility is, most either don't know or think it's downplaying abilities – pretending we are "dumb." Pretending we are something we are not, is psychosis (a detachment from reality.) Are humble people timid? What is humility?

Simply put, true humility is the opposite of being timid. Humility is being as interested in other people as you are interested in yourself. A truly humble person can see themselves as who they are, in truth, aware of not only their strengths but also their

weaknesses. It means that when you meet a new person you are about how incredibly awesome is your current thing. Humility means taking time to look up at the sky instead of looking only in the mirror.

Humility is the opposite of inflated self-esteem. A puffed up ego at age 8-14 can lead to resentment at age 20-25. (If I'm so wonderful, but my talents aren't on the news, and I'm still a "nobody" at age 25, then I feel envious and resentful of those who are more successful. If I am humble then I rejoice at the success of others and am happy with my portion.)

Humility leads to gratitude and contentment. Researchers are discovering that a grateful attitude is the cause of happiness not the result of happiness. At the core, isn't happiness a large part of what we hope for our children to discover?
