LCA STRINGS

FOURTEEN STUDENTS GRADES 4-8 ENROLL IN FIRST STRINGS COURSE

Each year LCA looks to expand programming and offerings and this year at the request and inspiration of several LCA parents, we reached out to Cornerstone Music, an afterschool music school that rents space at upstairs at First Baptist. The result is the first LCA introductory strings course. Students learn basic violin, and music theory with the Suzuki method to lay the foundation for further musical development in the years to come. Intro to Strings is the first official elective course where students are allowed the option of enrolling, or choosing not to enroll, based on interest.

This is not our first partnership with Mrs. Decker as she was our very first music teacher back in our very first year teaching basic music theory, recorders, and voice. Mrs. Decker has a bachelor's in Music Education and a master's in Theology and is an excellent fit on the LCA faculty team.

Students who have enrolled in this course attend strings class twice a week. Classes will culminate in a performance at our end-of-the year celebration. Students who have enrolled in basic strings course this year will be eligible to enroll in Orchestra next fall where they may choose to continue with the violin or transfer their skills to the cello or viola. We also anticipate offering the Intro to Strings course again next fall for next year's third and fourth grade students.



Feed the Need Kicks Off

Families of LCA students gathered for a taco bar night on February 23 to kick off the Feed the Need campaign. Students are eager and excited to participate this year, some even asking to be allowed to get started the weekend before our kickoff. For families that elected to use the Fundraising Discount, Feed the Need is our second required fundraiser.

Our favorite part about Feed the Need is that while we raise money for our school, we simultaneously meet a need globally and locally. Students ask for donations towards our campaign which culminates in a packing party where we pack 10,000 meals that we then ship through Feed the Hunger to refugee camps in Bangladesh, and share with local food banks.



In the areas in Bangladesh where we send the meals, families toil from dawn to dusk yet their earnings barely cover the cost of a single meal. Some families can't find any work at all. Jesus taught us to care for the poor and the vulnerable. When we serve others in need, we follow His example, offering not just nourishment for the body, but also restoring joy and hope to the heart.

Rhetoric – Spotlight

Students at LCA learn Bible, History and Literature combined into one class - Humanities. This year's Rhetoric class is studying world history and enjoying in depth learning from Reverend Preus.

At the end of a unit students compete against each other in teams for points answering questions from their notes to prepare them for their unit exams.

Do you know who won the first Punic war? Or, what mountain the roman army crossed to invade Italy? What animals did the roman army bring famously across the Alps? Ask an LCA Rhetoric student they can tell you. They can also tell you the Latin word for "soldier," "she wolf," and many others.



This year our campaign goal is \$30,000, which means that each LCA family needs to raise \$900. Our remaining financial need for the rest of the school year is \$45,000 so many families are working towards this goal instead. To date LCA has raised \$12,041 and we are almost at the half way mark. With four weeks left, it's totally possible.

We know that all our provision comes from the Lord and are excited to see what He sends this year through the student and family asks and generous LCA donor responses during our Feed the Need Campaign!
