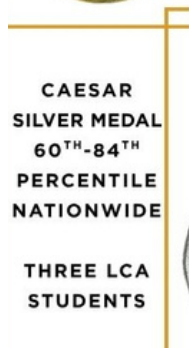
NATIONAL STUDENT AWARDS

ACCS ACCREDITATION

Accreditation with the ACCS (Association of Classical Christian Schools) is a rigorous process that provides mentorship to schools as well as proof of high academic standards.

After being in operation for the required five years, we submitted a self-study documenting how we meet accreditation standards in seven subjects: 1. mission, vision and planning, 2. accountability, independence, and stability, 3. governance and administration, 4. student virtue and school community, 5. classical curriculum, 6. faculty and instructional resources, and 7. student work samples.

Each subject required anywhere from 19 to 104 supporting documents which needed to be both shown (linked) and described (or narrated) as to how it met the required standard. In total, we submitted 318 documents for the accreditation visit team to review.

Once our self-study was submitted, the next step was a school visitation. A Head-of-School from another classical school, along with the ACCS director of accreditation visited LCA May 5th and 6th to observe classes, and talk with teachers, board members, and administrators.

After the visit, the team recommended LCA for a two-year, K-8 accreditation, which is the maximum time awarded for first time accreditations. The accreditation team congratulated LCA on the hard work in preparation that teachers and administrators had clearly contributed. Commendations included our board governance structure, our music program, our comprehensive biblical integration in classroom subjects, and our identity as a praying school that is dependent on the Holy Spirit for direction.

We are eligible to accredit our Rhetoric (High School) program beginning fall of 2028 and are on track for graduating our first class in 2029 as graduates from a fully accredited, ACCS, K-12 school. Colleges and universities across our country recognize ACCS accredited schools as producing desirable graduates who are fully prepared to become successful college students.

By going through the accreditation process, which really began year one, LCA gained guidance in how to set up our academy administration with industry best practices that facilitate longevity. "It's a different perspective to think through how to set things up so our children's grandchildren can attend LCA (should Jesus tarry in his return) while still being in start-up," reflects Mrs. McKamey regarding the accreditation process. "Having the wisdom of other classical school administrators and the ACCS accreditation requirements helped us create some of the long-term policies and strategies and was an immeasurable benefit."

Accreditation with the ACCS also provides LCA with dual accreditation with the NCPSA (National Council for Private School Accreditation.) NCPSA is a member and participant with the regional accrediting associations as part of the Alliance of Regional Accreditors. See www.ncpsa.org for a list of NCPSA recognized accrediting agencies. Meet "Atilda-the-Hun" our new (to us) Xerox AltaLink, our newest copier to date at only six years old. To save costs, LCA does not lease a copier, rather we buy (most are donated) second (or even third/fourth) hand copiers when they become affordable (0-\$500,) which is usually just as the copier model hits the end-of-life phase. We copy and print high volumes of material that you would naturally expect to find in any school.

We have learned much through YouTube on how to maintain and fix copiers but eventually they stop working when we are no longer able to buy parts or their drivers become obsolete. With our high usage and typical copier age at purchase, purchasing one copier per year (sometimes two) has become a trend. While this still is a significant cost savings, the process of finding, buying, picking up the new one and disposing of the old one has become quite fatiguing.

We pray with this most recent model, still being sold and serviced by Xerox, that we can enjoy copies and print outs from "tilly" for more than one year.



Rhetoric Update

Our Rhetoric (High School) program is doubling in size in the 2026-7 school year. Upcoming freshmen and returning sophomores are excited about new program opportunities such as dual accreditation and annual trips such as: fall backpacking overnight hike, a spring mission trip, and a senior capstone trip (possibly to Italy!) LCA Rhetoric students who enroll in the LCCC dual accreditation program and take three courses per year (one per semester, one in the summer) have the opportunity to graduate high school with an associates degree. Ending high school with half of a bachelor's degree is very attractive for some students/families.
